WHY HAVE PLAYER RANKINGS?

In the Singles, Scotch Doubles, and Team Events at ACS and CCS Championships, divisions are based on skill level so players have a better chance to compete fairly and enjoy success.

- Advanced+
- Advanced
- Open
- Standard
- Rec

If more than one player ranking is grouped within a division, a game spot will be given to the lower player ranking(s).

HOW DO PLAYER RANKINGS GET ASSIGNED?

At the time of tournament entry, your player ranking will be the higher of these two established rating sources:

CompuSport CSR

Your established Compusport CSR player rating.

FargoRate -> CSR

**Your established Fargorate player rating
(which will be converted to CSR).**

UNRANKED PLAYERS

League Players: Men are assigned CSR 1700 and women CSR 1600, with League Operator approval.

Non-League Players: Men are assigned CSR 1800 or higher and women CSR 1700 or higher.

PROFESSIONAL PLAYERS

Professional players are allowed to play if their CSR, or their team's total CSR, is below the cap for the event entered.

- Professional women playing in an 'All' Singles event
- Professional men or women playing in a Scotch Doubles event
- Professional men or women playing in a Team event

KNOWN ABILITY (KA)

ACS and CCS reserve the right to assign or change the player ranking of any player based on KA - Known Ability.
